Wynton Marsalis on Making 20 Years of Jazz at the Lincoln Center's Rose Hall

Five Facts About Wynton Marsalis:

• Early Life and Education: Wynton Marsalis was born on October 18, 1961, in New Orleans, Louisiana, into a highly musical family. His father, Ellis Marsalis, was a renowned jazz pianist, and his brothers Branford, Delfeayo, and Jason are also accomplished musicians. Wynton studied at The Juilliard School in New York City.



- Jazz and Classical Accomplishments: Marsalis is a highly skilled trumpeter in both jazz and classical music. He is the first and only musician to win Grammy Awards in both genres in the same year, achieving this feat in 1983 and 1984.
- Artistic Director of Jazz at Lincoln Center: Marsalis is the managing and artistic director of Jazz at Lincoln Center in New York City, where he also leads the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra. His work with the organization has been pivotal in promoting jazz education and preservation.
- **Pulitzer Prize Winner**: In 1997, Marsalis became the first jazz musician to win the Pulitzer Prize for Music for his oratorio Blood on the Fields, which explores themes of slavery and freedom in America.
- Advocate for Music Education: Marsalis is an avid advocate for music education and has authored books, given lectures, and developed programs aimed at teaching young people about jazz and its cultural significance.
