



# **April: The Month to Celebrate Jazz History**

April stands as a beacon of celebration for jazz history, honoring a genre that has shaped American culture and influenced music worldwide.

The designation of April as Jazz Appreciation Month (JAM) originated in 2001, spearheaded by the Smithsonian National Museum of American History. The initiative was created to recognize jazz as a treasured national and global heritage, promoting its legacy through performances, education, and public programs.

The month of April was chosen for its symbolic significance:

- April 30th marks International Jazz Day, established by UNESCO in 2011. This day highlights jazz's role in promoting peace, dialogue, and intercultural exchange.
- · Many jazz legends were born or passed away in April, including:
  - Duke Ellington (born April 29, 1899) One of the most influential composers and bandleaders in jazz history.
  - Billie Holiday (born April 7, 1915) Known for her emotive vocal style and powerful influence on jazz and pop singing.
  - Herbie Hancock (born April 12, 1940) A pioneering jazz pianist and composer whose innovation spans decades.
- April also symbolizes renewal and creativity, much like jazz itself, which thrives on improvisation and constant evolution.

Throughout the month, jazz organizations, schools, and venues host concerts, workshops, and festivals, showcasing the rich diversity of jazz styles—from New Orleans Dixieland to bebop, fusion, and contemporary jazz. The month not only celebrates the genre's musical brilliance but also highlights its impact on civil rights, cultural expression, and social movements.

April, with its blend of historical milestones and the spirit of creative expression, is the perfect month to honor jazz—the timeless art form that continues to inspire and unite people across generations.



# Congratulations to the Winners of the 15th Annual Jazz Pensacola Student Jazz Competition:

On Saturday, March 22, in the Mainstage Theater on the campus of the University of West Florida, nine student finalists performed for the 15th Annual Jazz Pensacola Student Jazz Competition.

Student finalists were selected from submitted applications and digitally recorded performances of two tunes demonstrating their jazz skills. Judges for the live event were professional musicians and educators Cynthia Domulot, Bob Maksymkow and Don Snowden. During the competition, the students were accompanied by professional musicians Mary Chavez, Steve Douglas and Jimmy Roebuck. Roger Villines was the Master of Ceremonies. Special thanks goes to the University of West Florida for providing the excellent venue and stage support.

Each student performed two of their chosen jazz tunes before a live audience, after which the judges deliberated and determined the following placements. Students were then presented with monetary awards ranging from \$100 to \$500. They were all winners!
